## Academic Documentation Requirements

To be eligible for acceptance into the Professional Program for the proposed entry semester all documentation must be available for review by the Academic Affairs/Professional Program Committee by the following dates.

Required date for receipt of all documentation	Entry Semester
August 1	Fall Semester (August Professional Program start)
January 1	Spring Semester (January Professional Program start)

**NOTE:** The course documentation must appear on the University's Degree Audit Report System (DARS) by the date indicated above in order to be eligible for acceptance into the Professional Program. This includes KSU courses taken, all seminars with a CR grade, transfer transcripts, acceptance of all AP credits through the KSU Admissions Office, and all quiz-out or special examination grades. If the required academic documentation items are not available by the designated date, the student will NOT be considered for the Professional Program.

Typically transfer course transcripts for courses taken in the Fall semester will not be available in time for acceptance in to the Professional Program in the Spring and transfer course transcripts taken in the Summer will not be available in time for acceptance in the Fall. Usually this process requires three to six weeks for the Admissions Office to process and post on DARS, therefore students should plan accordingly. It is the student's responsibility to confirm that all credits are posted prior to the deadline dates listed above.

### Minimum and Recommended Laptop Requirements for Students Entering the Professional Programs Beginning Fall 2018

#### Minimum Requirements:

- Windows 10 Pro (64-bit). If using a Mac, it must have Windows installed with Boot Camp
- 7<sup>th</sup> Generation Intel i5-7200U Processor (dual core, 2.5 GHz base clock with 3.1GHz Turbo Boost, 3MB cache)
- 8GB RAM
- Direct X 11 capable graphics card or on-board graphics processor
- 1 TB 5400RPM hard drive or 500GB solid state drive
- 15" Screen
- **Approximate Cost: \$500-\$700**

\*Note: When purchasing a laptop exceeding the minimum requirements, priority should be given to an upgraded processor.

#### Recommended Requirements:

- Windows 64-bit operating system
- 7<sup>th</sup> Generation Intel i7-6700HQ Processor (quad core, 2.6GHz base clock with 3.5GHz Turbo Boost, 6MB cache)
- 16GB RAM
- Dedicated Graphics card with 2GB memory
- 1 TB 5400RPM hard drive or 500GB solid state drive
- 17" Screen
- **Approximate Cost: \$900-\$1,100**
